Wang Shoujun delivered a speech of

Taking the Trend, Building Dreams. On behalf of the university, he expressed welcome and congratulations to the new students, and then introduced the splendid educational traditions of Beijing Normal University, as well as its positive contributions to the prevention and control of the epidemic. He explained that BNU Zhuhai is of great strategic significance to the construction of "Double First-Class" of BNU. Wang Shoujun encouraged students to comply with the requirements of the times, respond to the call and the needs of our country, inherit the "red gene" and glorious tradition of century-old BNU, remain devoted to our family and country, consolidate knowledge, improve innovation skills, and strive to grow into greatly responsible youth in a new era. He put forward three expectations for the freshmen. First, set the trend of the times, bear dreams in mind and

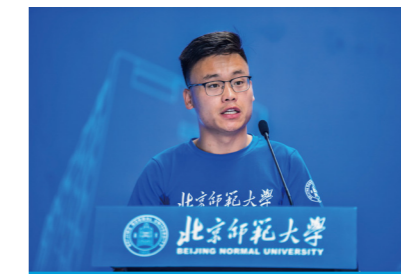


fulfill those dreams. He hoped that the students would inherit BNU's original aspirations of serving the country through education, establishing the belief in serving the people, and taking the leading position in teaching. Second, he hoped that students would continue to renew knowledge, read eagerly and practice a lot in university, growing into the nation's mainstay-diligent in learning, willing to think, and good at exploring and being of tremendous ability and strength. Third, he expressed his expectation that students, not fearing hardships, were courageous enough to challenge, to strive hard, and to make achievement that our country and people can be proud of.



Professor Di Zengru, a doctoral supervisor of School of Systems Science, Beijing Normal University and an academician of the International

Academy of Systems and Control Sciences, spoke as the teacher representative. He interpreted the two keywords of the new era: "change" and "connection," hoping that when dealing with the changing and complex world, students will be faithful and upright, pioneering and innovating, walking hand in hand, and becoming talents who can shape the new era.



2019 master's student Xie Qingling, 2020 Chinese Language and Literature student Nong Yuan, and 2020 PhD student Che Zhilu, from the Institute of Economics and

Resource Management, respectively spoke as the representative of graduate students, undergraduates, and PHD students. They said that as the "back wave" of the new era, shouldering the responsibility of the times, they should inherit the fine traditions of century-old BNU, practice the university motto of "Learn, so as to instruct others. Act, to serve as example to all," working hard together to realize BNU's dream of constructing a world-class university and the Chinese dream of the great rejuvenation of the nation.

BNU Zhuhai has established the Institute of Advanced Studies in Humanities and Social Sciences, Advanced Institute of



Natural Sciences, the Belt and Road School, and College of Education for the Future. In July 2020, BNU launched the construction of the first batch of residential colleges in Zhuhai: Leyu College, Huitong College and Zhixing College, to inherit and carry forward more than a one-hundred-year heritage of BNU and an important force to carry out the fundamental task of educating people with morality and to promote "Three-Alls" (all staff, all stages and all-round) education. In 2020, BNU first set up the "Zhiyuan Program" to enroll undergraduates from the on-list 52 national poverty-stricken counties, which aims to cultivate high-quality teachers and future educators with lofty aspirations and enjoyment in teaching in basic education.

This year, BNU Zhuhai welcomed 2,298 undergraduates, masters and doctoral students. Today is a good start for university students. We wish every newcomer would dream big and move forward in this beautiful campus in the next four years.

Cheng Jianping Discussed with the First Batch Freshmen of “Zhiyuan Program”

On September 17, 2020, the meeting with the first batch freshmen of “Zhiyuan Program” was held at BNU Zhuhai. Cheng Jianping, Chairman of the University Council of Beijing Normal University, had a cordial discussion with 15 representatives of the first batch of “Zhiyuan Program” students. The meeting was also attended by Sun Hongpei, Deputy Chairman of the University Council and Secretary of the Disciplinary Committee; Wang Shoujun, Vice President of BNU and Director of the Administrative Committee, BNU Zhuhai; Zheng Guomin, Assistant to the President and Vice Provost of BNU; as well as heads of the University Party Committee Office and Admissions Office; heads of BNU Zhuhai and teacher representatives. The meeting was chaired by Zheng Guomin.

This year, under the guidance and support of the Ministry of Education, BNU launched the “Zhiyuan Program” to recruit the best candidates for undergraduate teacher education programs with targeted employment from provinces where the 52 national poverty-stricken counties are located. This program was initiated in order to put President Xi’s important thought—“To alleviate poverty, education is a must”—into practice. It aims to help win the battle against poverty, and to assist



in the strategy of rural revitalization. The first 148 freshmen have come to BNU Zhuhai and started their university life.

The 15 students who participated in the meeting came from seven provinces. They shared their original intention of choosing the Program, their understanding of the teaching profession, and their four-year university plans. Many students talked about the guidance and help from the attentive teachers throughout their growing years. It was the teachers’ instruction and careful guidance that had helped them to overcome difficulties, get out of troubles, excel in the college entrance examination and embrace a broader life. Some students were influenced by the urgent need to improve the education in their hometown and expressed the regrets they felt when they served as teaching volunteers that children in poverty-stricken areas could not receive high-quality education. They were also

distressed that the destitute areas could not retain excellent talents. Their words were plain but their emotions sincere. It was these factors that had prompted the students to choose the “Zhiyuan Program” when making university applications. They choose to teach in impoverished areas after graduation, bringing more hope to those children, so as to change their lives through education.

Chairman Cheng Jianping listened to the speeches of 15 students, expressed his appreciation for their determination to pursue great ambitions and their commitment to education, and introduced the origin of the “Zhiyuan Program” to the students in detail. To help the poor, we must first raise their educational level: to reduce the development gap between the east and the west, the most important factors are talents and education. The quality and quantity of talents in

the western regions must be improved through the mechanism of talent “backflow.” Beijing Normal University recruits “Zhiyuan Program” teacher education students, aiming to train high-quality basic education teachers and future educators who have lofty aspirations, enjoy teaching and are good at it for the national poverty-stricken counties, and become the “gold” and “seeds” of the area where they serve to improve the educational level and qualities of local residents comprehensively.

Cheng Jianping put forward three hopes for the students’ college life. One is to strengthen the belief in teaching and make unremitting efforts to become a good teacher with “Four Haves (ideals, morality, knowledge, and love).” Every one of them came with the ideal of education, but during the four years of college, they will without doubt encounter various challenges, hesitations and indecisiveness. In the constant ideological struggle, they must strengthen their belief in teaching and take the “Four Haves” standard to require themselves

to study hard and grow up happily in the university. The second is to be not only a good learner, but more a creator. In its first year, the Zhiyuan Program needs to explore and improve the talent training model. Students should be actively involved and become participants and developers of our education and teaching reform. The third is to help and learn from each other in the community to achieve common development. It is necessary to strengthen the construction of the college and classes, and form a community of unity, friendship, efficiency and mutual help. BNU will continue to provide post-employment

training and improvement support for the students of the Program, and truly help students “get on the horse,” see them off, and provide lifelong support.

Cheng Jianping encouraged the students to be full of confidence in the future and look at problems from a development perspective. The poverty in western China will surely improve year after year. Freshmen of the first batch of “Zhiyuan Program” should start well and set an example to help the Program have a greater impact and encourage more high school graduates and outstanding students to join the shared cause!

The Unveiling Ceremony of Phoenix School and 2020 BNU Phoenix Forum Held

On December 22, Beijing Normal University at Zhuhai held the unveiling ceremony of Phoenix School and the first Phoenix Forum of Beijing Normal University. The topic of the forum was "Global Symbiosis—Education for the Future". Luo Yonggang, Deputy Director of the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the Macao S.A.R, Zheng Xinyou, Representative of Wang Dong, Acting Commissioner of Office of The Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of The People's Republic of China in The Macao S.A.R and Director of Department of Information and Public Diplomacy of the Office and Wang Zhiwei, Deputy Director of Office of Hong Kong, Macao and Taiwan Affairs, Ministry of Education, officiated at the ceremony. Sun Hongpei, Deputy Chairman of the University Council of Beijing Normal University; Wang Shoujun, Vice President of Beijing Normal University and other officials attended

the ceremony. Leaders and guests from sister schools, publishing houses, primary and secondary schools as well as kindergartens in the GuangdongHong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area (GBA) were also present. Wei Wei, Secretary of the Party Committee of BNU Zhuhai presided over the opening ceremony.



At the ceremony, Sun Hongpei read out the approval of the establishment of Phoenix School and the appointment of the dean. Luo Yonggang, Zheng Xinyou, Wang Zhiwei, Wang Hongbing, Chen Zhilin and Wang Shoujun jointly inaugurated the establishment of the Phoenix School.



In his speech, Wang Shoujun said that Beijing Normal University, taking the leading role of teacher education in China, has been a proactive practitioner and promoter in the opening-up of education to the outside world and international exchange. *The Beijing Normal University Global Development Strategic Plan (2020-2025)* released this year sets the goal of participating in global cooperation and development of higher education with a more open attitude and more energetic dynamics, serving the great cause of the rejuvenation of the Chinese nation and the building of a community with a shared future for mankind. Therefore, the Phoenix School of Beijing Normal University was established. The Phoenix School will extensively integrate high-quality educational resources around the globe to build an open, independent and diversified platform for the cultivation of international talents, pressing ahead of the internationalization of school education, and optimizing the cultivation system of "talents with global competence." The International Education Forum "Global Symbiosis—Education for the Future" is a starting point for the Phoenix School. Availing ourselves of this opportunity, we hope to establish a long-term communication mechanism with all the participants, experts and scholars,



and to contribute Chinese power to global education development and Chinese proposals to global education governance.

Wang Zhiwei noted BNU Zhuhai has been giving full play to its advantages in educational resources in the GBA. Relying on the Ministry's "Ten-Thousands Talents Program" and other projects, the cooperation with the University of Hong Kong, the University of Macao and other universities has been strengthened. The official inauguration of Phoenix School is another brand-new exploration of BNU Zhuhai and an important embodiment of the construction principle of "High standard, New mechanism and Internationalization." The establishment of Phoenix School is of great significance in playing the university's leading role in developing basic education with high quality, and in serving the education of the GBA in a deeper and broader scope.



Gou Renmin expressed that the current situation of education in Macao is substantial, which also contributes to the successful practice of "One country, Two systems" policy in Macao. But, for the medium and long-term development and stability of Macao in the coming 30 years and beyond, education has to be further consolidated for stable and promising prospects. The establishment of Phoenix



School has brought new opportunities to Macao, and Gou hoped that Zhuhai Campus and Phoenix School can assist in the cultivation and training of teachers in Macao. In the end, Gou expressed his belief and sincere wishes that under the active efforts of Beijing Normal University and the Administrative Committee, BNU Zhuhai, with the support of the Ministry of Education, the Diplomatic Office, the governments of Zhuhai and Macao Special Administrative Region, the schools and the relative educational societies, Phoenix School and BNU Zhuhai will surely get better and better!

Chen Xi, Dean of Phoenix School said that Phoenix School, with the goal of promoting the development of international education and training high-level talents with a global vision, would insist on the principles of "carrying on the fine tradition of Beijing Normal University, enhancing cultural exchanges, committing to the cultivation of talents and promoting international education." The school will fully absorb the teaching resources of first-class universities at home and abroad, and form an all-round, wide-ranging and multi-level educational platform which opens up to the outside world under the guidelines of mutual learning, inclusiveness and inter-connection. She also mentioned that Phoenix School would promote international education in terms of developing high-quality international education projects, opening some courses of professional dual degree and specialty programs, carrying out training projects in Hong Kong and Macao, establishing a multilingual and interactive language village and optimizing the international spread of Chinese civilization.

The "Future Design Seed Fund," launched at the press conference, is designed to support 10 to 15 design projects, with funding ranging from RMB 500,000-2,000,000 yuan for each project. By fostering innovative design talents with a strong sense of responsibility as well as scientific and professional knowledge, the seed fund aims to promote the participation of teachers and students in experimental cooperation of innovative design, incubating future-oriented teaching teams.

In September, 2020, BNU Zhuhai officially announced the admission of the MFA Program (Part-time) for the Year 2021 Master of Arts, with an estimated enrollment of 30 students. The MFA Program is jointly conducted by BNU School of Arts & Communication



and Future Design School (in preparation) with a 3-year cultivation term. Courses will be instructed at both Beijing and Zhuhai campuses, combining teaching resources within a mobile classroom mode. The scholarship and overseas exchange grant of the MFA program will also cover 50% of the program students.

The Future Design Center is a research-based center established in November, 2019, and it carries out the preparation for the establishment of the Future Design School estimated in early 2021.

From November 13 to 15, the 2020 Advanced Science and Technology Forum on Interdisciplinary Studies (ASTFIS) was held at BNU Zhuhai. The forum was sponsored by the Advanced Institute of Natural Sciences of BNU and jointly organized by eight research centers or laboratories of BNU including the International Academic Center for Complex Systems; the RDC for Watershed Environmental Eco-Engineering; the Center for Biological Science and Technology; the Center for Statistics and Data Science; the Research Center for Mathematics; the Research Center for Applied Mathematics and Interdisciplinary Sciences; the Research Center for Mathematics and Mathematics Education; the Zhuhai Branch of State Key Laboratory of Earth Surface Processes; and Resource Ecology.

The forum included an invited guests' keynote report, one main forum, four sub-forums, a postdoctoral academic salon and a poster exhibition to share the latest research achievements on the frontier of interdisciplinary studies of science and technology.



Wang Shoujun, Vice President of Beijing Normal University and Director of BNU Zhuhai Administrative Committee; Fu Ailian, Deputy Director of BNU Zhuhai Administrative Committee; and Zhuo Yingqiang, Deputy Director of Zhuhai Science and Technology Innovation Bureau, attended the opening ceremony on the morning of the 14th. More than 280 students and teachers from more than 30 universities, research institutes and key laboratories of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, representatives of enterprises in Zhuhai, and persons in charge of teaching and research institutes and administrative departments of BNU attended the opening ceremony, which

was presided over by Liu Jingling, Vice President of the Advanced Institute of Natural Sciences of BNU.

Wang Shoujun pointed out that with the development of the times, the cutting-edge scientific researchers needed to break through the restrictions of a single discipline and eliminate the barriers of disciplines. At the National Graduate Education Conference held at the end of July this year, the Ministry of Education decided to add interdisciplinary as a new discipline category, making it the 14th discipline category in China. In October, the National Natural Science Foundation of China (NSFC) established the ninth University Department: the Department of Interdisciplinary Science, which was the first new department of science established by the NSFC since the last one was created 11 years ago. Colleges and universities should actively face the future, promote the construction of interdisciplinary research platforms and the cultivation of

interdisciplinary innovative talents from a prospective perspective to serve the national strategic needs with interdisciplinary integration. BNU will vigorously support the interdisciplinary development, and strive to build this forum to be an important platform for the researches of interdisciplinary frontier on natural science and technology. It is hoped that experts and scholars take this forum as an opportunity to establish in-depth communication and cooperation, making greater contributions to the interdisciplinary research and innovation of China.



Zhuo Yingqiang pointed out that with the acceleration of the construction of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area (GBA), Zhuhai as an important city of the area had encountered a golden opportunity for development. Zhuhai Municipal Government will continue to optimize and improve the science and technology innovation policy system and introduce various supporting policies, creating an excellent policy environment and providing institutional guarantee for innovation and development.

Professor Sir David King, Fellow of the Royal Society, Emeritus Professor of Cambridge University, the first Director of Smith School of Enterprise and the Environment, Oxford University and Emeritus Professor of BNU, congratulated the forum through a video as the representative of experts. How Do We Communicate with the World in 2020? The 2nd Forum On Developing an International Bay Area (2020) Held in Zhuhai

On the morning of November 28, 2020, the 2nd Forum On Developing an International Bay Area (2020) was held at BNU Zhuhai. The forum was hosted by BNU Zhuhai and co-organized by BNU Research Center for Cultural Innovation and Communication in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area (GBA), the Institute of Advanced Studies in Humanities and Social Sciences of BNU, the

Institute of Cultural Innovation and Communication of BNU and the Beijing Institute of Culture Innovation and Communication. Experts and guests from government, enterprises, universities and research institutes in the Greater Bay Area gathered together to attend the forum themed "Developing an International Bay Area: Deepening Humanity Exchanges, Promoting Cultural Consensus and High-Quality Development of Belt and

Road Cooperation". The attendees made proposals in terms of facilitating in-depth exchanges of different civilizations, enhancing cultural consensus and mutual learning and making progress in the Belt and Road cooperation.

Zhang Guangping, Deputy Director of the China Center for Contemporary World Studies, International Department, Central Committee of



CPC; Cai Xinhua, Chairman of Zhuhai Federation of Social Sciences; and Wang Shoujun, Vice President of Beijing Normal University and Director of BNU Zhuhai Administrative Committee, affirmed the significance of the forum. Professor Yu Dan, Dean of the Institute of Cultural Innovation and Communication of BNU and the chief expert of the Research Center for Cultural Innovation and Communication in the GBA released a research report on *Intercultural Communication and "the Belt and Road" Public Diplomacy Discourse Strategy Enhancement* in the forum.

As the world undergoes dramatic changes in 2020, Professor Yu Dan pointed out that the destiny of mankind is shared, and the world is an indivisible community. We should strengthen the dissemination and practice of humanity exchanges, and actively provide public goods to the international community. She also believed that China needed to tell the world its own development story and future direction. The report focused on the current situation of intercultural communication and investigated the value and application of intercultural communication cases from the five perspectives, including civilization origins, civilization evolution, civilization interaction, daily life and brand communication,

as well as the corresponding five pairs of cases. Finally, Professor Yu Dan put forward four suggestions on the construction of public diplomacy discourse strategy, namely respecting cultural differences, deepening humanity exchanges, enhancing cultural consensus and integrating digital culture.

Afterwards, the guests of the forum offered their advice and proposals on promoting the joint development and cooperation of "The Belt and Road Initiative." Ke Yinbin, Secretary General and a senior researcher of Chahar Society; Wan Zhe, a researcher of BRS at BNU; and Liu Ying, a researcher of Chongyang Think Tank at Renmin University of China, expressed their own views and suggestions on advancing economic development and cultural cooperation in parallel, as the two wheels driving the construction of the "the Belt and Road" forward. Researcher Li Dingxin, Director of Strategic Research Department of the Center for Contemporary World Studies, compared and analyzed the characteristics of Chinese and foreign cultures from three aspects: civilization origin, development courses, and the prospect. Wu Yihong, senior researcher of Taihe Think Tank, stressed that the construction of international influence

of Chinese culture can be carried out from five aspects: accurate cultural publicity, investigation of media needs in targeted countries, foreign student resources, strengthening of English culture building exchange between the two sides and good agenda planning. Huang Yue, Vice Dean of the Belt and Road Academy of Beijing Language and Culture University proposed that languages as the core of cultural drive were of great significance in building "the Belt and Road" Sinology community.

The forum was strongly supported by the Zhuhai Federation of Social Sciences, the Institute of Social and Cultural Research of Macau University of Science and Technology, Institute of Contemporary China Studies of Hong Kong Baptist University and Tin Ka Ping Foundation. In the process of promoting strategic progress of "the Belt and Road Initiative," The GBA not only takes up significant geographical advantages in term of economic and trade cooperation, but also serves as a crucial channel to bridge the gap between different cultures. In today's complex international environment, enhancing cultural consensus of different countries through cultural communication with the premise of containing cultural confidence is a significant mission of the Greater Bay Area and the manifestation of strength and vitality of it.

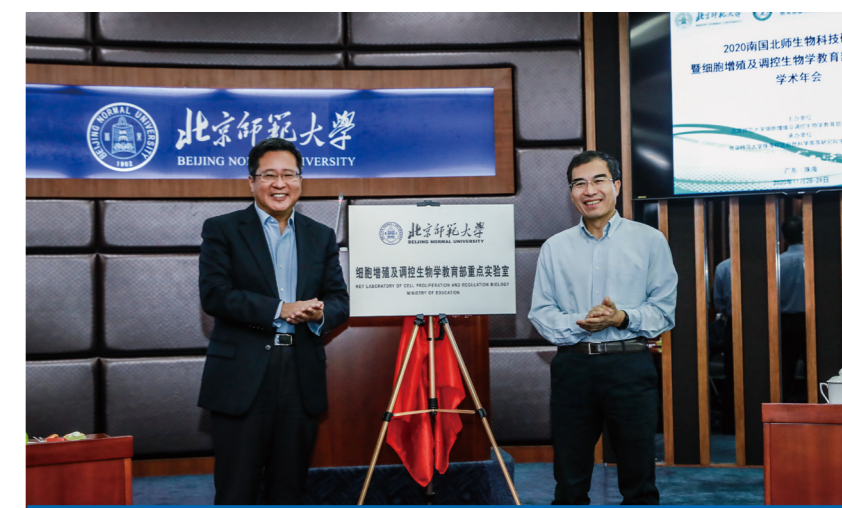

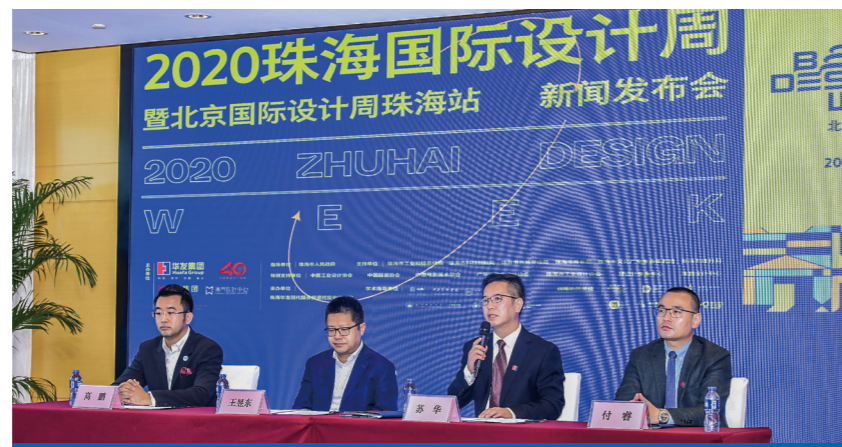
On December 4, 2020, Zhuhai International Design Week and Beijing International Design Week (Zhuhai Station) grandly opened at Zhuhai International Convention and

countries around the world and shared the report of international evaluation of the design industry in China. He also introduced the

development of design education in China. By comparing the design schools in different cities, he pointed out that the resource investment in

design education in the Pearl River, Yangtze River and Yellow River basins is setting off a momentous wave of design development.

Exploring new design forces: FDC experts participated in the award ceremony of the Design Power Award of the Greater Bay Area

"Zhuhai Design Award—the Greater Bay Area Design Force" is jointly initiated by Zhuhai International Design Week and Beijing International Design Week. It is the first local original IP award in the design field in Zhuhai. By adopting

an international vision and operation method, it focuses on the talent scout including leading design professionals, elite designers, and avantgarde designers, and provides a promotional platform of industrial innovation design

in the Greater Bay Area.

Dr. Gao was invited to serve as the award judge, and Dr. Tony Brown, a member of the FDC Academic Committee, was invited as the guest of proffering the award.

Multi-drive creative voice: FDC was appointed as the academic guidance unit of the Design Week

This design week was themed "Better City and Great Health." The main events, lasting from December 4th to 6th, included six major events: Academic Exhibition, Design Dialogues, Awards, Exchanges, Design Journey, and Design Expo.

From the launching ceremony of the Design Journey, the Design Week Press Conference to the main activities of the Design Week, Beijing Normal University FDC participated in the academic guidance throughout the whole process and encouraged designers and design

teams from all over the world for the submission of the "Beijing Normal University Future Design Seed Fund." Via this Seed Fund, FDC hopes to attract outstanding designers to gather in Zhuhai, making Zhuhai a hub for innovative design talents.



The 2nd Jingshi Belt and Road Forum Held at BNU Zhuhai

The Belt and Road Experience Exchange Seminar on Ensuring and Improving People's Livelihood – “The 2nd Jingshi Belt and Road Forum” sponsored by the National Development and Reform Commission and jointly organized by the China Institute of Education and Social Development, Beijing Normal University, and the Belt and Road School, Beijing Normal University was held on December 19 to 20, 2020.

Wang Shoujun, Vice President of Beijing Normal University and Dean of the Belt and Road School, gave the opening

remarks at the forum. He said that “high standard” and “people-centered” are important principles for the high-quality development of the Belt and Road Initiative. “People-centered” seeks the development that benefits all people, and aims to bring a real sense of gain to people of different countries and to make concrete contributions to the local economy.

Zhang Boli, an academican of the Chinese Academy of Engineering, delivered a speech via video. He pointed out



that ensuring and improving people's livelihood through the development of the Belt and Road in the post-pandemic era is a great and forward-looking topic. Making a post-pandemic plan while carrying out the current epidemic prevention and control, a plan to ensure that the world economic and social development can continue to move forward, and especially that people can return to normal lives as soon as possible, is a very important proposition.



Gan Zangchun, Vice President of the China Law Society, pointed out that the high-quality development of the Belt and Road needs to be based on international cooperation in the rule of law. Jiang Yaoping, the former Vice-Minister of the Ministry of Commerce, explained with abundant data about how the Belt and Road Initiative has been bringing benefits to people of different countries through win-win cooperation since it was implemented seven years ago.

The forum centered on “Improving People's Livelihood Through the Common Development of the Belt and Road” and conducted in-depth discussions on education, poverty alleviation, medical and health care, elderly care, employment promotion, and other related topics.



Participants offered advice on the high-quality development of the Belt and Road in the post-pandemic era by sharing development experience, proposing approaches for improvement, and examining cooperation opportunities. Over 200 participants, including Wen Hua, Deputy Secretary of Zhuhai Municipal Government, and experts, scholars, and entrepreneurs from Tsinghua University, Renmin University of China, Chinese Academy of Social



Sciences, Xiamen University, China Agricultural University, relevant government departments, and other universities and research institutes, attended the forum.

Searching for Charm of Chinese Characters in 'Valley University'

In order to better carry out the “Experiencing China” and “Fenghuang Ambassador” series of activities, enabling international students to experience charms of Chinese characters, enhancing their understanding of public signs on campus and acting as International Campus Advisors, International Office held a Chinese learning class and a campus public signs discussion with the theme of “Searching for Charms of Chinese Characters in ‘Valley University’” on November 4, 2020.

This activity began as a Chinese learning class. Some Chinese public signs with ambiguous meanings were shown by the presenter, whose

humorous language immediately captured the attention of the international students. Besides, the presenter also explained the connotation and history of names of landmark buildings at BNU, including Xi Garden on Beijing campus, Muduo Building on Zhuhai campus, and other well-known buildings on campuses. For the first time, international students learned profound meanings and cultural heritage of names of university buildings, deepening their understanding of the BNU motto “Learn, so as to instruct others. Act, to serve as example to all”



and the cultural spirit of BNU.

This activity enhanced international students' understanding of the history and culture of BNU through learning Chinese characters on campus public signs and allowed them to appreciate the beauty of Chinese characters. It not only broadened their knowledge about the connotation of Chinese characters, but also established a solid foundation for the upcoming “Experiencing China • Dialogues with the Ancients” lectures and experiential activities including calligraphy, poetry, and crafts. Meanwhile, as International Campus Advisors of the “Fenghuang Ambassador” project, they contributed to the establishment of the international campus by providing suggestions for improvement of English signs on campus.



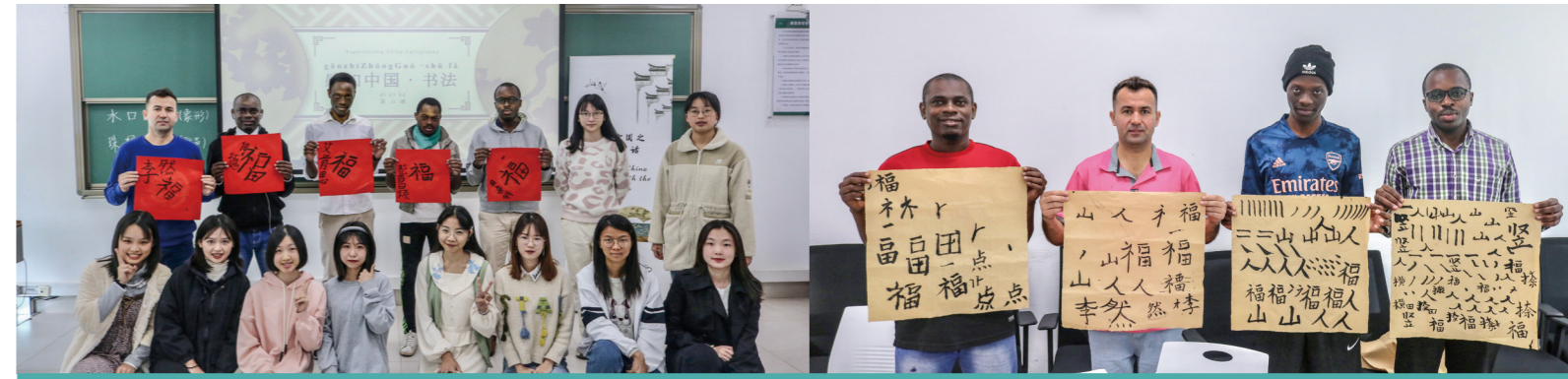
The Art of Calligraphy

The International Office held two calligraphy experiential classes, themed “Experiencing China• Dialogues with the Ancients” on November 28th and December 5th, which demonstrated the charm of Chinese characters to international students, enhancing their understanding

of Chinese traditional culture, and having the first-hand experience about the art of Chinese calligraphy. International students from the Belt and Road School attended the classes.

In the first class, the presenter briefly analyzed the distinctions among

characters of different periods. Then, through an engaging video, international students were able to have a better understanding of the origin, developments, and the profound history related to the Chinese characters. In addition to this, the presenter also displayed



some calligraphy masterpieces, such as Chairman Mao's inscription of “Beijing Normal University” and



the noted calligrapher, Mr. Qi Gong's inscription of the BNU motto: “Learn, so as to instruct others; Act, to serve as example to all.” International students practiced the basic strokes—horizontal, vertical, left-falling, right-falling ones and dot. They also tried to write some simple Chinese characters, such as “human” and “mountain.”



Another presenter illustrated two ways of forming Chinese characters in the second class. International students explored the characteristics of Oracles through the comparison between simplified Chinese characters and Oracle, such as “water” and “farmland.” They also drew pictures of wagons and compared them with “che”(wagon) in Oracle to have a deeper insight into the Hieroglyphics, which was a method in Chinese word-formation.

These calligraphy experiential classes gave international students a preliminary insight into Chinese characters, the long-standing Chinese culture and their rich historical connotation. Meanwhile, they experienced Chinese calligraphy for the first time with great interest, and learned the charm of Chinese characters.

Traditional Customs and Poetry Class



The International Office organized a class on traditional customs of Spring Festival and poetry learning, themed “Experiencing China • Dialogues with the Ancients,” on December 20, 2020, to introduce traditional customs of Spring Festival, the charm of the Chinese language and cultural connotations of poetry to international students. International students from the Belt and Road School attended the class.

First, the presenter Zhang Mingzhu played a video clip about Spring

Festival, introducing both traditional and modern celebration activities in the Spring Festival, such as replacing peach wood charms, setting off firecrackers, reunion dinners, watching the Spring Festival Gala, lion dancing and going Spring Festival shopping, and vividly illustrated the original intentions and meanings of these customs.

Next, the presenters took the custom of replacing peach wood charms as the introduction and presented an ancient poem *Yuan Ri* (The first day

of Spring Festival) for international students. In the explanatory session, Wang Chu carefully selected some important words in the poem, such as “Bao Zhu” (fireworks), “Tu Su” (herb wine), “Tong Tong” (brightness and warmth of sunrise), and “Xin Tao” (new peach wood charms). After the presentation, the presenters invited international students to recite *Yuan Ri* together, patiently listening to their practice and demonstrating correct pronunciation and intonation. Later, they also helped improve their intonations one by one.
